I am sure you have noticed the difference in the look of the Parish Life. In February of 2007, we rolled out our first issue in a brand new format. In response, many of you have offered positive feedback at the changes.

Have you noticed? We are living in a radical revolution in the means of communication. If you don't believe me, just ask the finest newspapers in the nation who are losing subscribers and advertisers in their print on paper versions and who are trying to invent and hold an online presence that pays the bills.

Churches have been a part of the revolution too. More and more churches are transitioning from print publications to online publications. And so in addition to the format changes, we've begun emailing a link for this newsletter to many of you online. Those receiving the online edition have remarked that you've enjoyed seeing the pictures in color online, and having the publication in your email inbox immediately after it has been completed.

Some percentage of you just don't, won't, or can't read anything online. To those of you who have a worried look on your face, you have nothing to worry about. We won't be dispensing with the paper version of *The Parish Life* anytime soon. However, some of you have expressed an interest in receiving the online version of *The Parish Life* only. I know this because you've told me so.

In response we are doing a couple of things. First, we're inviting all of those with email addresses to share them with us - young and old. Right now St. Luke's doesn't have a comprehensive list of email addresses of parishioners and we need them. Please take a moment and send us your email address, even if you don't want to receive *The Parish Life* online. (see box)

Second, we are asking that you let us know how you'd like to receive this publication. The new *Parish Life* online is handsome with the color and design we can't afford to print on paper. And it's instant on the day of publication. You'll be able to receive it via email (along with weekly mini-updates of parish announcements and photos) merely by letting us know your email address. By receiving the online version only, you will save a few trees and help Saint Luke's save a few dollars. Whatever option you choose (see box), we hope you'll help us make this work.

## STAND OR KNEEL?!?!

The Prayer Book is a wondrous tool.  
Liturgically, it sets the rule.  
But it sometimes makes it tough  
When it doesn't say enough.  
In the Eucharistic Prayer,  
There is not enough help there.  
'Cause it gives two ways to go.  
Stand or kneel: who's to know?

Do I stand or do I kneel?  
Is it up to how I feel?  
How to tell which posture fits?  
Maybe I should simply sits?  
It can make me feel so dumb  
To be E-pis-co-pal-i-an.  
Maybe I should not be proud  
And find a less aerobic crowd.

Here's a principle to heed  
If you're looking for a lead:  
(If you're not, ignore this cue,  
And pray the way you always do.)  
Rite I says to kneel or stand.  
(Kneel preferred,  
but not commanded.)  
Rite II puts that in reverse:  
Stand or kneel (Note:stand is first).  
Rite I: You may want to kneel,  
Rite II: Standing has appeal.

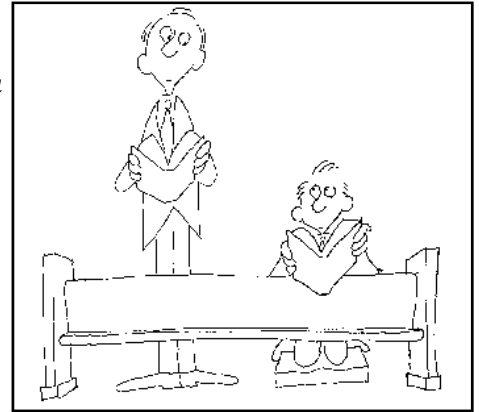
But here's the deal,  
it seems to me.  
We don't all have to agree.  
Some can only pray on knees.  
Some must stand  
to make their pleas.  
The bottom line, as I see it,  
Whichever stance you choose,  
so be it.  
The thing to stress, I would say,  
Is that you've found  
this place to pray.

You'll meet God here in this space.

We're like a great big family.  
We differ, and that makes us see  
That while this fine point we discuss,  
The main thing is that God loves us.

## MEREDITH ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE NEWS

The Endowment Committee is pleased to announce that the Madison County Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) has been named the first recipient of the Hal and Beth Meredith Outreach Fund awards for the 2007-2008 fiscal year. CASA is a nonprofit organization established in 1996 with the mission of recruiting, training and supervising community volunteers who advocate for abused and neglected children in Madison county.

The Hal and Beth Meredith Outreach Fund was established by the Merediths' estate upon Hal's death and is administered by St. Luke's and the Endowment Trust Committee. The Merediths specified that funds were to be made available to benefit underprivileged, destitute and financially needy people within Madison County. With this first award, 90-120 of the county's most vulnerable and impoverished citizens, its children, will be given a voice in the child welfare system and an advocate to work on their behalf.

According to state statistics, Madison County's substantiated child abuse rate is more than double that of the state average and exceeds the rates of larger urban areas such as Shelby and Davidson counties. CASA's volunteers work directly with the children in the child welfare system, as well as the support persons involved in the childrens' lives, such as doctors, relatives and teachers, to identify each child's unique needs and make recommendations to the courts. They give these children a voice in their own futures and follow them after they exit the system, to ensure the child's needs continue to be met.

CASA's grant request, funded for \$30,000, provides for the hiring of an additional Advocate Supervisor, who would be charged with recruiting, training and supervising an additional 30 CASA child advocate volunteers. CASA estimates that by the end of the fiscal year, at least 90 additional children will have been served by these new advocates. Currently CASA is operating at almost maximum capacity, with one full-time and one half-time advocate supervisor, who together supervise 43 volunteers. National CASA regulations stipulate that supervisors cannot oversee more than 30 volunteers.

Many thanks to all who have contributed of their time and talent to making this first grant cycle a success! Grants will continue to be awarded on an annual basis, with applications being accepted in the Spring of each year.

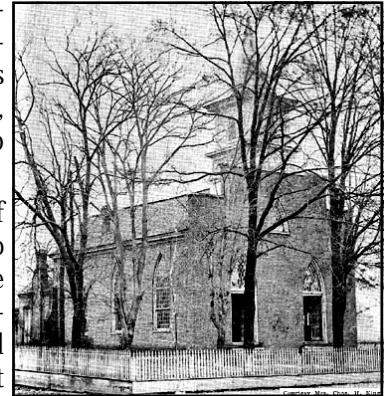

## ST. LUKE'S EARLY HISTORY

*by the 'Saint Luke's History Department Chair'*

On the Second Sunday after Pentecost, Fr. Sean alluded to John Wesley's conversion at Aldersgate Street and his subsequent commitment to evangelism. Thomas West, the "grandfather" of St. Luke's Church, joined Mr. Wesley in his travels, promoting personal experience in worship in the liturgy.

Fr. West was a Priest of the Church of Ireland (Anglican) and he immigrated to New York in 1791. He served the diocese in New York City before moving to Philadelphia. In 1832 he moved to Jackson and lived on the corner where First Methodist Church stands.

His great-granddaughter, Margaret Elizabeth McCowat, wrote his story in our Church Registry. She tells us he was the first Episcopal priest in West Tennessee. He rode a circuit through Madison, Hardeman, and Haywood counties and served as St. Luke's second rector.

He was known as "Grand-Father" West; he was garrulous and burly. When he laughed, he laughed all over. He named his mule "John Wesley." When criticized for this defamation, he would reply: "You don't know how much I love that mule."
