Rector's Annual Address - 12/16/07
Welcome to the Third Sunday of Advent. This Sunday I am charged

with the task of giving the Rector's annual address, and as Christmas is speeding ever closer, I think it necessary to say a word or two about Advent. Advent is a season of journey, of hoping, and of waiting. The Spanish verb *esperar* conveys two possible meanings all at the same time... "to wait" and "to hope."

As such, it's a more helpful term than either of the English verbs that separate out those two postures. Waiting, you see, is hoping; hoping, you see, is waiting. Faithful life in Advent is multi-dimensional. It waits, incomplete. Yet, it's joyful in what will be fulfilled. It's perceptive, seeing what is. It's hopeful of what will be.

When I addressed this congregation last year in my annual address, I'd barely been your rector for 6 weeks. I spent a great deal of time in last year's address articulating a vision for Saint Luke's: that we become more welcoming and friendly; a place of hospitality, a place that makes room for the next person through the door. I challenged us to be "loose around the edges and solid at the core". I used the image of concentric circles. That solid "core" – the inside circle is our faith and what we believe."

The core is the holy table with its holy food. It's the word of God given particularly in Scripture and gathered up in the preaching and proclamation of that Word. The closer you move to the center of things, the closer you move to the unchangeable content of the faith. At the minimum that content would be: God created the world and all of us, and saw that it was Good. God is loving and redeeming us and raising us up in Jesus Christ. And the Holy Spirit is available to all to animate the ministry of God's presence in the world.

The outer of the concentric circles is our boundary – our border. We all live inside those boundaries – some closer to the center than others. I challenged us to ask ourselves as a congregation if we are "loose around the edges." In other words "are our borders permeable?" I asked, "Are we warmly inviting new folks to participate in worship and in the life of the parish beyond our worship, or are we erecting walls that prevent participation?" Do folks that don't look like us, or act like us, or think like us become a part of this congregation?

Frankly I have been shocked during my time with you. Shocked in a good way... a great way. Because in every congregation I have ever worked with has had self-assigned individuals who have made it their mission to select who would be a part of the congregation. To my delight, we haven't spent our time pushing new people away. Instead, you are welcoming those who

are new.

There's a long list of successes this year, but for me, the very most exciting thing that has happened is that 15-20 new families have made Saint Luke's their church home. Literally, they have become a part of the family. We have been a community that has been loose enough around the edges that others have made their home with us. To you who have made St. Luke's your church home over the last year: We're glad you're here. We are glad you are part of the family! Welcome home! To you who have been here: thank you for engaging the mission I put before us.

I continue to believe that there is no greater priority for any congregation than to be loose around the edges and solid at the core; or said another way, to have a bias toward the next person through the door.

There are many additional successes that more than worth mentioning, and I have a handful that I would like to share, because they're descriptive of the year we've spent together. In this past year we have moved coffee hour to the narthex and you have made coffee hour a priority. I want to thank Lyn Wheeler for her coordination of coffee hour and each and every one of you who have brought food. I also have to thank those of you who stay and talk and meet those who are new and welcome them to this place we call home. Even these simple are ministry. Yes, even the small act of coffee hour is ministry. In fact, this is as important as anything else we do here at St. Luke's.

One of our newest avenues of welcome has been Holy Grounds Coffee House. As a part of the Jackson Downtown Development Corporation's Fabulous Fridays (on the last Friday of the month) we've opened our doors to the community featuring artists and musicians, and free coffee and cake from HRH Dumplin's. At least 60 people have attended each and every month. Last month over 120 joined us at Holy Grounds. The wonderful news is that we are seeing more than just the usual suspects darken our doors. People who have never been to Saint Luke's before are discovering St. Luke's. Holy Grounds is one of the ways new folks are coming among us. I was so proud of our 175th Anniversary Celebration at the beginning of October. The service and silent auction and dinner with featured speaker Alex Comfort... they were important and powerful events. I am told the Bishop bragged about us at the Diocesan Offices that we did the celebration right, and that our celebration was the best he attended.

There have been absolutely fabulous events this year in addition to the 175th celebration... The calendar party was a joy to behold as it is each and every year. Thank you to each of you who made it a success. Also of particular note for me was St. Nicholas celebration this year. What a fun event filled with the joy and laughter of children.

I am extraordinarily proud of our Meredith Endowment committee headed by Dr. John Godbold. This group of folks did the hard work putting an endowment in place and they did it right. They have put a system in place that will use the endowment for generations upon generations, reaching out to the Jackson community. Their first outreach grant was awarded this fall... \$30,000 to Madison County CASA. CASA is an acronym for Court Appointed Special Advocate It's a program that trains volunteers to provide a judge with a carefully researched report on a child who has had to be removed from their parents and their circumstances to help the court make a sound decision about the child's future. Hal and Beth would be so proud.

I would be remiss if I didn't mention the great joy it brought to me to celebrate the end of the construction of this nave. Countless hours were spent

over the last 4 years by our building committee headed by Gus Middleton. Hats off to each of you. You did fabulously and the evidence is in front of us each and every week as we enter this breathtaking and holy space.

One final happy report: Our stewardship campaign was an overwhelming success. 95% of our stewardship goal was committed for a total of almost \$297,000, given by over 100 families, and we're still receiving pledges. 60% of you increased your pledges. 15 families made a pledge for the very first time this year. Quite frankly, every one I know has said that this has been the most successful stewardship campaign that they can remember in this parish. Thank you Jimmy Harrison... thank you Jimmy Harrison.

Because of this successful stewardship campaign, it is my pleasure to share with you that our finance committee is presenting a balanced budget at our parish meeting today – the first balanced budget presented in four years. Folks, you have much to be proud about.

Theologically, Advent and Christmas aren't just seasons, they are ever-present realities. Christ is coming. Christ is born in us. Christ will come again. It is our task to prepare and be ready for Christ who comes.

We have preparation to do. There is more work to be done. We have more work to do among homebound members. We have more work to do with our youth. We have more outreach to do: we are hopeful and preparing.

How might our Christian community live so as to be ready for the coming of Christ at Christmas? We must continually ask ourselves, Are we sharing in grace? Are we mutually generous? Are we welcoming the stranger as Christ? Do we acknowledge God's good work in one another? Do we hold one another in our hearts? Are we loose enough around the edges that others can come along side?

This is the season of waiting, of expectation, and of hoping. This is the season to remember that God is not finished with us. God is not finished with the church. God is not finished with the world. God will bring to completion all that has begun. Advent is the season to wait with grateful hope. The God who has come, promises to come in greater completeness.

Friends, God's redemptive work is underway in and with us. And from where I sit, that's good news.

May Christ continue to be born in our lives and in our parish as we embark upon the adventure another year together. Amen.

IRS GUIDELINES FOR MONETARY CHARITABLE DONATIONS

Please do not file your 2007 tax return until you receive your Statement of Contributions from the parish office. The IRS has very specific guidelines to charitable donations. To assist you in filing your tax return, we have gathered the following information from the IRS. For more specific information, please go to their website at www.irs.gov.

"To deduct any charitable donation of money, a taxpayer must have a bank record or a written communication from the charity showing the name of the charity and the date and amount of the contribution. A bank record includes canceled checks, bank or credit union statements and credit card statements. Bank or credit union statements should show the name of the charity and the date and amount paid. Credit card statements should show the name of the charity and the transaction posting date.

Donations of money include those made in cash or by check, electronic funds transfer, credit card, and payroll deduction. For payroll deductions, the taxpayer should retain a pay stub, Form W-2 wage statement or other document furnished by the employer showing the total amount withheld for charity, along with the pledge card showing the name of the charity.

Prior law allowed taxpayers to back up their donations of money with personal bank registers, diaries or notes made around the time of the donation. Those types of records are no longer sufficient. This provision applies to contributions made in taxable years beginning after Aug. 17, 2006. For taxpayers that file returns on a calendar-year basis, including most individuals, the new provision applies to contributions made beginning in 2007.

The law does not change the prior-law requirement that a taxpayer get an acknowledgement from a charity for each deductible donation (either money or property) of \$250 or more. However, one statement containing all of the required information may meet the requirements of both provisions.
