FROM YOUR RECTOR... by the Reverend Sean Ferrell



February 6 is the first day of Lent. Nine years ago, when Kiezha and I got married on February 6, it never

occurred to me that we would have to share our wedding anniversary with Ash Wednesday. It is a rare coincidence and this will be the only time Ash Wednesday falls on February 6th in our lifetimes. In fact, this is the earliest Ash Wednesday has fallen since 1913 when it fell on February 5. So if you've been thinking to yourself that Lent is early this year, you weren't hallucinating. It is early!

Before Jesus began his ministry, he was tempted in the wilderness for forty days. Withstanding temptation in the wilderness amid a forty-day fast, Jesus began a ministry of preaching, teaching, and healing that lasted for just three years. Because of this time of sacrifice and self-denial, the early church required converts to spend forty days in preparation for baptism and the faithful to spend forty days before Easter in a time of self-reflection and penitence.

We at Saint Luke's will join many modern Christians in spending Lent in a time of sacrifice and self-denial. Many will fast and pray and take on prayerful disciplines. Many will mark the beginning of Lent by attending Ash Wednesday services in which ashes made from last year's palms are marked on the foreheads of the penitent. That mark symbolizes the humble beginning of the journey to Good Friday and ultimately to the new life that is Easter.

As we enter this Lenten journey together, I am hoping we will consider the kind of sacrifice we make. I know that some of us will plan to give up swearing or chocolate or ice cream. In fact, Shrove Tuesday (Feb. 5 at 6 p.m.) (sometimes known as Mardi Gras) is all about getting rid of the fat in the cupboard in preparation for the Lenten journey.

At St. Luke's we join the ancient practice of both giving things up, but I hope you will also resolve to take some things on as a part of the Lenten discipline we're called to by the Book of Common Prayer. You see, in most cases, giving up something for Lent is more meaningful if you use the money or time for another purpose. If you give up caffeine, you can use your desire for caffeine as a reminder to pray. If you give up meat during Lent, consider giving the money to those in need.

Another opportunity to take something on is to spend your Wednesday evenings (beginning February 13) participating in our five week Lenten Program, which will not only be educational, but spiritually experiential. During the first four weeks our program will allow us to experience some ancient celebrations of the Eucharist, giving us a window into the way people worshipped prior to the Reformation beginning with the early Church on to the

high Middle Ages. Then on the fifth and final week, we will share in an instructed Prayer Book Eucharist, which will explain why we do what we do. Our Lenten Program always includes dinner, so we will gather at 6 p.m. and eat in the Parish Hall and then celebrate the Eucharist right there in the Parish Hall. This will provide us the greatest amount of flexibility with how we set up our worship space so that you can see how earlier Christians have worshipped. I am hoping at the end of the five weeks that you will understand something of the development of the Eucharist and how Christians have worshipped over the course of Christian history. I am also hoping that you will find this an opportunity to worship and not only educationally, but spiritually fulfilling. And so that we don't stack two celebrations of the Eucharist directly on top of each other, our regular 5:30 service will be a service of Evening Prayer instead of Eucharist.

Gail Spruill, in her article about the United Thank Offering, (page 7) shares that we'll be using the United Thank Offering as a parish-wide Lenten Discipline. We hope you will join us in making UTO a personal discipline.

Our Mission Committee is again planning a "Living Parable of the Talents" for us. Playing off of the Parable of the Talents from the Gospels, each person is given \$5 and asked to use their talents to make more. What a wonderful Lenten opportunity. There are more details on page 6.

Another great Lenten discipline is to plan to attend church each Sunday, and participate in our special Holy Week services. Whatever you do, plan to do something.

Many of you may have read my previous article about subscribing to "Community Supported Agriculture" farms and specifically about Avalon Acres in Hohenwald, Tennessee. We had nine families subscribe from the Jackson area for the fall and winter season and due to the response, the farm has committed to deliver Spring/Summer subscriptions to the Jackson area each Saturday morning at the Jackson Farmers' Market.

Spring/Summer applications are available at www.avalon-acres.com, as well as details about the various options and pricing. In short, you commit to paying the farm a weekly fee for a "share" of the produce grown through their network of farmers. If they have a fruitful growing season, you benefit by receiving more than your expected share. If they have a poor season (due to drought, frost, etc.) then you may receive less variety or quantity.

SUNDAY CONCERT SERIES

The next concert will feature Randal Rushing, acclaimed Memphis tenor. Dr. Rushing is Professor of Voice and Associate Director for Student Services at the Rudi E. Scheidt School of Music, University of Memphis. He has performed extensively though-out Germany, Switzerland, Central America, and the Czech Republic, as well as the United States. He recently made his Lincoln Center debut in Handel's Messiah. He made his debut in 2001 with the illustrious St. Cecilia Chorus at Carnegie Hall and has made three return appearances there. In addition to singing with the Memphis Symphony, he has performed with the Chicago Symphony and the Shreveport Symphony. A recipient of the Rotary International Foundation Scholarship, he studied at the Staatliche Hochschule fur Musik Rheinland in Koln, Germany. Upon completion, he had opera engagements throughout Europe and made regular appearances on German and Swiss television.

In addition to his University responsibilities, Dr. Rushing leads the music at the Church of the Annunciation in Cordova. The concert on March 2 will be a potpourri of favorites from stage and opera. Concert time is 4:00 pm, and a reception will follow. Childcare will be provided. Please invite your friends to hear this outstanding performer.

MISSIONS TRIP AND PARABLE OF THE TALENTS FUNDRAISER

Ros Reycraft has contacted me about a mission trip to El Hogar again this year. The dates will be May 3-10. As always, we will have ample opportunity to interact with the children of El Hogar. In addition it appears that we may be assisting with the building of a new dormitory for the boys. The trip entails air fare (about \$750 last year), room and board (about \$100) and the group needs to provide \$2,000 for materials expenses. Rick and Ros Reycraft, their friends Tom and Jane Habig, and possibly a couple of other people and myself will be going. If anyone else is interested please let me know. My phone number is 664-9049.

The fundraiser based on the Parable of the Talents will also take place this year March 1st through March 31st. If you wish to participate, you will get \$5 dollars seed money to finance your fundraiser. Use that money to purchase supplies for your fundraiser. Some ideas-polish shoes, make food to sell, create art work, sharpen knives, do some house or yard work, tutor someone, baby-sit. The idea is to generate money from the \$5 dollar seed money. The funds raised will help to defray St. Luke's portion of the \$2000 for the mission trip and hopefully help cover our annual sponsorship of Kelman at El Hogar. Please consider either going on the mission trip, helping with the fundraiser or both! El Hogar for those who are new to St. Luke's is a mission school in Honduras who takes in boys and now girls who are living on the streets or from such extreme poverty that they have no future and gives them one. They go to school, are well fed and kept safe.

Contact is maintained with family if it is safe for the child. Once the child reaches 14, they then go either to the technical or agricultural school to continue their education and learn a trade. Once they have completed those four years, they then are able to support themselves and a family thus breaking the cycle of poverty. It is really incredible to see and be a part of this Christian Outreach.

THE UNITED THANK OFFERING

The United Thank Offering is a ministry of the Episcopal Church and a long standing tradition at St. Luke's that provides a way for men, women and children to give daily thanks to God with a sense of gratitude. It is most easily identifiable by the small blue offering box distributed to members of the parish. Essentially, it is a discipline that begins at home by placing coins or bills in the "Blue Box." The coins or bills placed in the box are designed to be the sum of our daily thanks for the blessing in our everyday lives—for good weather, happy times, job opportunity, and unexpected visits—there are so many things for which we can be thankful. It is the outward and visible sign of the spiritual practice of thanksgiving for all of our many blessings.

At the end of the designated period, you are asked to bring the amount of your daily thanksgiving for the ingathering. When the date of the Ingathering approaches, you will receive a blue envelope in the Parish Life. *Empty the contents of the box into the envelope and bring it to church on the appointed day or to the church office that week. Continue using your blue box for the next ingathering.* The total amount collected will be sent to the Episcopal Church Women, where it is combined with the offerings of hundreds of thousands of other Episcopalians to become the United Thank Offering.

Again this year, St. Luke's has selected to use the United Thank Offering during the season of Lent. It is our hope that you will make it a part or your own personal Lenten discipline. At the beginning of Lent (on Ash Wednesday, February 6 and on the first Sunday of Lent, February 10) the blue boxes will be available in the Narthex and in the Commons for anyone wishing to participate (adults and children alike!) Our Spring Ingathering will occur on Palm Sunday, Sunday, March 16, and you will find your blue envelope in this edition of the Parish Life.
