FROM YOUR RECTOR... by the Reverend Sean Ferrell



It has been over five and almost six years since tornadic activity threatened the life of this congregation. The first, of course, was literal, destroying our nave. The second was figurative, when former members of this congregation left over concerns with the national church, concerns over which Saint Luke's had no control. In August of this year, we will have been worshipping in our restored and renewed nave for a full three years – an entire lectionary cycle, and the exodus of former members from

this congregation is now a full five years ago. From everything I can see, the anxiety and the grief of 2003 and 2004 have abated, and we are moving on with Saint Luke's particular vocation and ministry in the heart of the city of Jackson. Our restored nave is beginning to feel "lived in" and our congregation has seen a tremendous influx of new families who have come to share with us in the life, ministry, work, and community of this parish. We are alive and vibrant, and we give glory to God.

With all of that said, it is time to begin talking about our future. Many of you wonder, I am sure (as I do), what the future of the Christian faith holds, and about the future of our particular way of practicing this faith as Episcopalians. Just as we've seen tremendous changes in the last hundred years in technology, we've seen new theological understandings in Christianity born out of studying the ancient church. This study of the ancient church gave rise to both the theological and liturgical reform of Vatican II that has shaped the Roman Catholic Church, and also gave rise to the birth of the 1979 Prayer Book. That same movement has ultimately has changed Western Christianity. For example, I often tell how my friend who is a Baptist pastor was formed more liturgically than his seminary trained Baptist forbears, and about how he learned about the sacraments in seminary. (Remember, Baptists don't have sacraments!) The old sayings about what Protestants and Catholics believe and disagree about have changed significantly in the last hundred years. The shape of Christianity is changing, and for the better I think.

There are some scholars who contend that the enormous changes we are experiencing in the life of the church are not just a part of a normal period in Church history, but rather a part of a shift that occurs about once every 500 years in the history of the church, the last one being the Reformation. Some, at least, contend that we are moving from the "modern era" to a new "post-modern" era.

This year's Lenten Program will focus upon where the church is headed in the future – what some have called the Emerging Church or "the Great Emergence". As a part of this program, we'll explore both the future of

WOODBURY AND MEREDITH SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS TEMPORARILY DISCONTINUED FOR 2009

The well established tradition of funding scholarships from the Woodbury and Meredith Scholarship Funds has become a victim of recent changes in financial markets.

As part of the St. Luke's Endowment Trusts, the scholarship funds are required to maintain the original corpus (the gift that established each fund) and allocate for distribution only from investment return.

Although invested in safe and conservative instruments, all of St. Luke's Endowment funds experienced a 26-27% loss in 2008, dropping each fund below the original corpus, and invoking a freeze on any further allocation or distribution until the original corpus of each has been restored.

It is the intent of the St. Luke's Endowment Trust Committee and the Vestry to resume funding the scholarships as soon as possible. Meeting in January, the Committee acknowledged with regret that it may be several years before the Trusts recover the original corpus and can begin making distributions again, but expressed confidence in the long term health of the entire endowment portfolio.

OTHER NEEDS

RIFA sends food home each weekend for almost 300 needy children through the snack-back-pack program. The community kitchen is currently serving an average of 150 people per day. RIFA also passes out nearly 200 sacks of food per month. These numbers will increase with the weak economy.

We ask that you please remember the needy when you are filling your shopping cart. This is a small way that everyone can help and individual contributions add up to a big help to those less fortunate.

This is a primary and vital part of Saint Luke's outreach to the wider Jackson community. Your assistance with any of the three RIFA programs is helpful.

DEVELOPING A LENTEN RULE

On Ash Wednesday each year, we are invited by the words of our Prayer Book to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word. It is not uncommon for Episcopalians to develop disciplines that they practice during the season of Lent. Below are some basic suggestions for developing a Lenten Rule.

1. **FASTING.** The weekdays of Lent (not the Sundays) are all fast days, meaning that the amount of food eaten is reduced. The idea is to undertake something sacrificial, yet not overwhelming. In addition, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are strict fasts: one full meal in the evening, and a light meal or collation in the afternoon. All those whose health, work, and age permit are invited to fast in some way. Abstaining from consuming excess goods and services is also a reasonable way to fast.

2. **WORSHIP.** Lent is a good time to add our weekday Eucharist to your usual observance, or to plan to attend each Sunday along with Holy Week services. Our Wednesday Eucharists at 5:30 p.m. are of a more intimate and quiet nature than the Sunday ones.

3. **SPIRITUAL READING.** An ancient custom is to take a spiritual book for regular reading during Lent. This can be a book of Scripture, or one of the spiritual classics. Some are available to borrow from the church library. If you are not sure what might be good, ask Father Sean.

4. **DAILY OFFICE.** If you do not now read Morning or Evening Prayer from the Prayer Book, Lent is a good time to start. It takes a little effort and discipline to get the habit established, but once it is there, it can bear great fruit. The regular prayers and psalms and Scripture draw us out of our narrow spiritual views, and nourish us with the riches of the Faith.

5. **CONFESSION.** A sacramental confession during Lent is not only an opportunity for a thorough self-examination, but also a powerful weapon against the temptations which come our way in Lent. Remember the old Anglican adage concerning confession: "All may, some should, none must."

6. **SERVICE.** As well as giving-up in Lent, some wish to take on some special service, such as visiting the sick or shut-in, taking special care for a neighbor who may need it, or some special project at church.

7. **SCRIPTURE READING & CLASSES.** Lent is a good time to take on Scripture reading and study, or indeed any study of the Faith. Our two adult Bible Studies, our Sunday morning adult Christian Education class, (see p. 2) and the Lenten Programs would fill this need. (See p. 2)

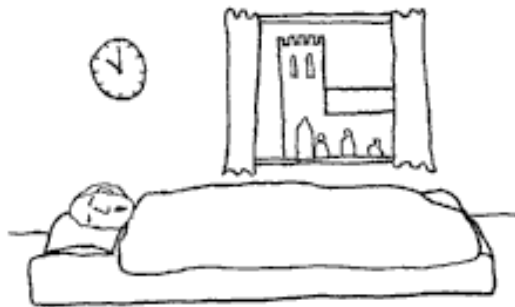

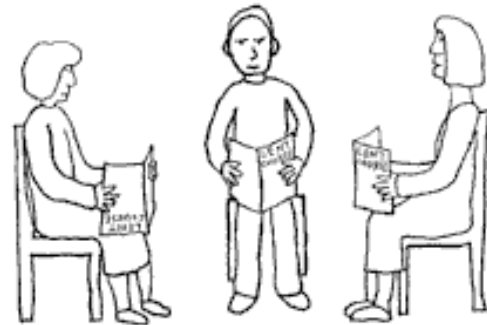
