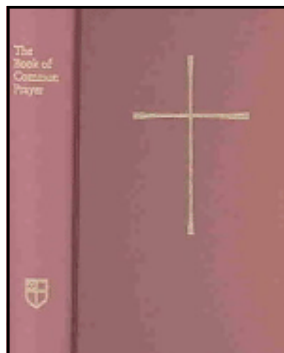
## FROM YOUR RECTOR... by the Reverend Sean Ferrell



The sixteenth century reformation of worship cannot be understood apart from a steady deformation of the liturgy, which began when Christianity became the official religion of the Roman Empire and reached its climax in the development of Low Mass, said by the priest alone rather than celebrated in community. The weekly joyful celebration of the Lord's Resurrection through the breaking of bread Sunday after Sunday denigrated to the point that the laity withdrew from receiving communion

and many received once a year as required by law. Baptism, a once great cause for rejoicing and communal celebration of the ancient church became a private rite within days of a child's birth by the time of the high middle ages, primarily because of high infant mortality, and in fear that the unbaptized would die and spend eternity separated from God.

It is to this high middle ages context that the reformation of the English Church responded. On June 9, 1549, the Feast of Pentecost, the First Book of Common Prayer was introduced into most parishes of the Church of England by an act of Parliament. It was one of the most characteristic and permanently influential products of the English Reformation and the beginning of the Prayer Book tradition within Anglicanism. We are direct heirs of that Prayer Book tradition in our own 1979 Book of Common Prayer.



What is the Prayer Book? The Book of Common Prayer is the source of our liturgy, guide to our worship, the heart of our tradition, and the ultimate statement of belief for Episcopalians. People often ask me what Episcopalians believe. There is no better way to tell them than to give them a Prayer Book, and invite them to come and pray with us. And so we do well to immerse ourselves not only in the worship of the Prayer Book (which we do each time we gather), but also to take time to learn more and deepen our understanding of this treasure of our faith tradition.

And so, during the month of June, I am taking the opportunity to teach a class on the Prayer Book during our Christian Ed hour. As you may know, this will be the only adult Christian education offering in June, and will be a great compliment to our Inquirers/Newcomers/Confirmation Classes (*look for them in August*). The class will be solely focused on our belief, theology, and spirituality as expressed in the Book of Common Prayer. As such, it will be a great education opportunity for Episcopalians old and new, and those who are brand new to our peculiar way of practicing the Christian faith.

The classes are based on the table of contents in the 1979 Prayer Book and will cover the following areas:

Week I: June 7-

The Calendar of the Church Year - both the liturgical year and the calendar of saints and how we add saints and some pending additions to be voted on at General Convention this summer.

The Daily Office - Morning and Evening Prayer, Compline, & Daily Devotions, along with some resources for praying these services.

The Collects - the prayers for each Sunday of the Church Year

Another of our liturgical books: Lesser Feasts and Fasts

Week II: June 14-

The Great Litany (and the Little Litany - did you know there was one?)

Proper Liturgies for Special Days - the services for Ash Wednesday, Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Vigil.

Holy Baptism - and our Baptismal theology.

Additional Topic: Prayer Book revision in the future.

Week III: June 21-

Holy Eucharist - Rites I and II and the differences between the two, along with the history and background of each rite.

The Prayers of the People (the one Rite I form and the six Rite II forms).

The Rubrics - Can we read italics?

Another of our liturgical books: Enriching Our Worship.

Week IV: June 28-

The Pastoral Offices - including Confirmation, the Celebration and Blessing of a Marriage, the Blessing of a Civil Marriage, Reconciliation of a Penitent (or private confession), the Burial Office, and "last rites".

Episcopal Services or services at which a Bishop presides including Ordinations of Bishops Priests and Deacons, the Celebration of a New Ministry, and the Consecration of a Church

The Psalter and The Prayers and Thanksgivings

The Historical Documents - the 39 Articles, the Chicago Lambeth Quadrilateral, and the Lectionary.

Another of our liturgical books- The Book of Occasional Services.

And so I invite you to come and learn more about our worship and theology as expressed in the Book of Common Prayer. Please know that you are welcome to attend classes as you are able. If you will be away for a week or two, don't hesitate to join us for the classes that you are able to attend. Blessings upon your Summer, and join us on Sundays at 9:15 am in the Library!

**SAM HENSLEY IN CONCERT - FRI, JUNE 5 AT ST. LUKE'S**

Roanoke, VA-based singer/songwriter Sam Hensley will provide musical entertainment at Saint Luke's on Friday, June 5 at 7:30 p.m. Sam is the husband of former Saint Luke's parishioner (the Rev.) Erin Seltzer Hensley.



His songs deal with the common, universal ideas of love, struggle, and relationships. For seven years, Sam has been teaching, writing, and leading music for groups of middle- and high school students, in attempts to build youth community through music and communal singing. Sam believes that "Music brings people together in a way that nothing else can. When we lift many voices to become one, there is real power in that."

While most of his work involves the Episcopal Church, he has also worked in public schools, camps, and conferences, teaching youth to write and work together in the creative process. In 2008, he released "And it goes like this...", a collection of music written for his work with conference and vacation bible school groups.

**THE DIOCESE OF WEST TN HAPPENING #46**

**SEPTEMBER 4 - 6, 2009**

Happening is a Christian experience presented by teenagers for teenagers with the help of clergy and lay adult leadership. The purpose of Happening is to provide a Christian Experience program to be one of the instruments within the Anglican Tradition to renew the Christian Church in the power of the Holy Spirit, in order that the Church may respond more readily to its call to spread the Kingdom of God throughout the world. Happening seeks to achieve this purpose by bringing young persons and adults to a fuller personal knowledge of and relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ and to a deeper level of commitment and apostle-ship.



Happening is open to any student in the 10th - 12th grade. This year's Happening will be Labor Day weekend, September 4 - 6. Registration is on a first come first served basis. Completed applications (forms and money) are accepted in the order they are received until the Happening is full or the deadline date is reached. Any incomplete applications received after the Happening deadline or after the Happening is full will be returned. Only 7 youth from each parish are allowed to attend at any one time. You must be sure to get Fr. Sean's signature on your application when you have filled it out for it to be considered complete. The cost is \$85 and the deadline is Friday, August 21, 2009. ## NEW FOYER GROUPS BEGIN AUGUST

New Foyer Groups will begin in August and run through November, 2009. Foyer Groups are an easy and enjoyable way for parishioners to get to know one another—especially newcomers and folks who go to different services-- in an informal social setting.

Each Foyer Group is usually composed of eight adults: three couples and two single people. Once each month, over a four-month period, group members meet at one another's homes (or sometimes at a restaurant) for a simple dinner, to get to know each other. Group members take turns hosting the dinners (usually held on a Sunday or Saturday evening) from about 6-8 or 7-9 p.m. At the end of each period, new groups are formed, to enable members to get to meet other people from St. Luke's. Members are automatically assigned to a new group at the appropriate time, unless they no longer want to participate.

Each Foyer Group has a convener/conveners, who contact the group members and set up the dates for dinners. 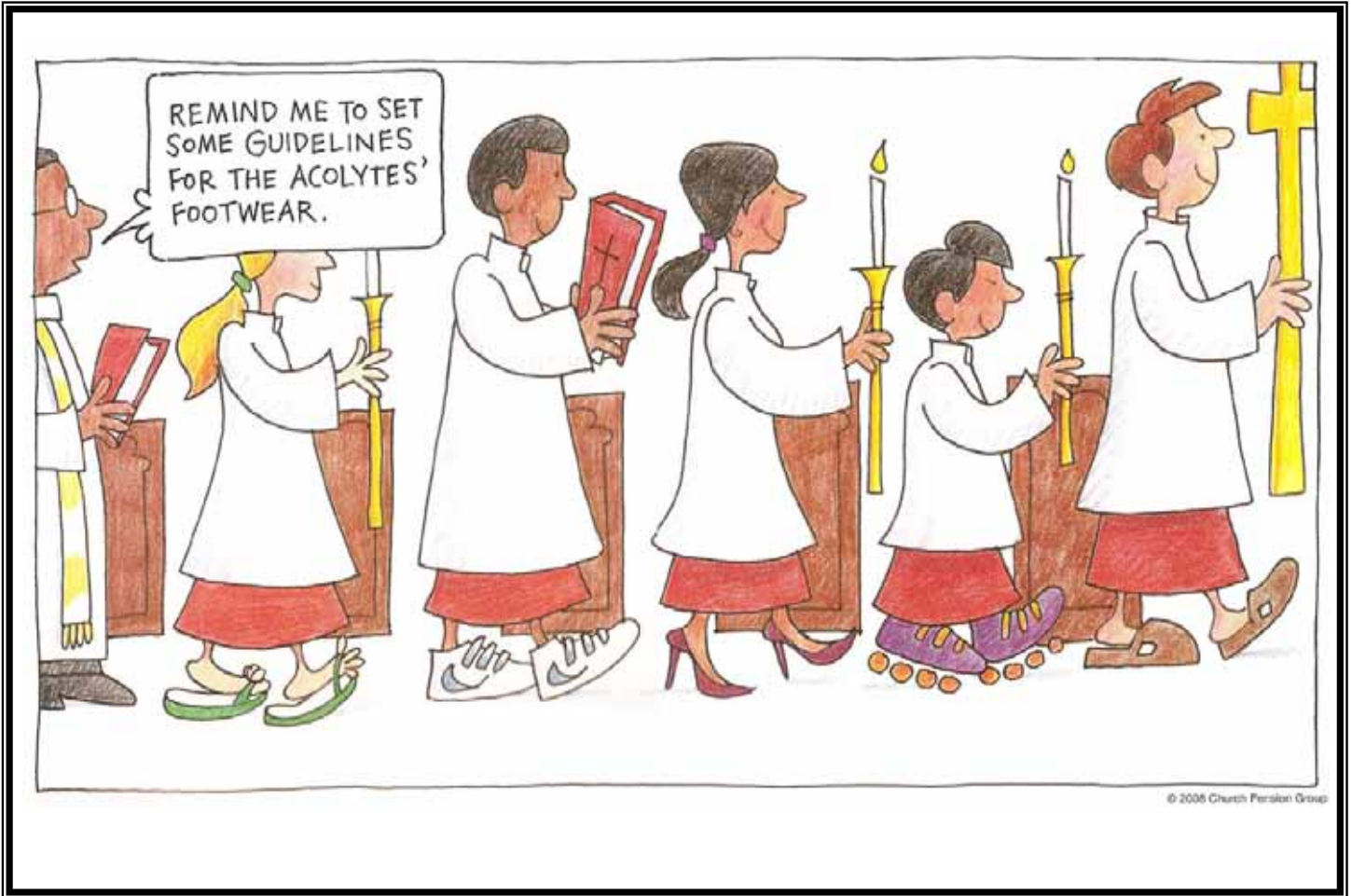
