FROM YOUR RECTOR... by the Reverend Sean Ferrell



If you've been at Saint Luke's over the last year you noticed that we've had something of a baby boom. I have good news to report: the Boom isn't over. As a congregation, we are expecting three new babies in the next two months and that is cause for celebration. We will celebrate with each of these three and their families around the birth of their children and we will celebrate with them at the Baptismal font. As we bring them up out of the water and mark them with chrism (oil blessed by the bishop) we will seal them and mark them as Christ's own for ever.

The Prayer Book recommends four feasts during the year for Baptisms - All Saints' Day, the First Sunday after the Epiphany - the Baptism of Jesus, the Great Vigil of Easter, and Pentecost. Additionally, the Prayer Book recommends that Baptisms occur when the Bishop visits. We are also free to add additional dates and we do from time to time depending on the need.

Our Catechism in the Prayer Book says that Baptism is the sacrament by which God adopts us as his children and makes us members of Christ's Body, the Church, and inheritors of the kingdom of God. If you have a little one (or a big one, or yourself, for that matter) to be Baptized, you then have a couple of available options in the not too distant future. On Sunday, October 26, Bishop Johnson will be joining us for his annual visit, and All Saints' Day, November 1, as one of the recommended dates, would be especially appropriate.

And because Bishop Johnson will be joining us on Sunday, October 26, 2009 for his annual parish visit, it means it is time to begin our confirmation/inquirers classes again. These gatherings are for people who are interested in learning more about the Episcopal Church, and also for those who are preparing to join Saint Luke's. The end result is that one may elect at the end of the process to receive the sacramental rite of Confirmation, or be Received (from another denomination that confirms), or Re-affirm your Baptismal vows. If you've been Confirmed in another denomination, often you can be Received as a member of the Episcopal Church. Further, if you have been Confirmed in the Episcopal Church previously, you are always welcome to join us for classes, and on the day the Bishop visits, he will recognize that

you have Re-affirmed your baptismal vows. (When I worked as a college chaplain I had many college students who Re-affirmed their baptismal vows when they had been Confirmed young and wanted to revisit the Confirmation process). The other option, of course, is to join us for classes alone.

We generally like for youth confirmands to be at least twelve years old because the Sacrament of Confirmation is really about making an adult profession of faith. However the overwhelming majority of confirmands that I have presented these last 10 years of ordained ministry have been adults. According to our Catechism in the Book of Common Prayer, “Confirmation is the rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through the prayer and laying on of hands by a bishop.” I do not call upon participants to memorize the Nicene Creed (or anything else for that matter), but rather to learn a little something about the church and why we do what we do. So consider joining us. Classes will begin September 13 in the library during our Christian Education hour at 9:15 a.m. If you are interested in participating, please do let me know, and plan to be with us on the 13th.

It is beginning to look like our Fall will be filled with celebrations. I invite you to come and take part!

BACK TO SCHOOL!

Hard to believe, but it’s back to school time already! Area families will spend the next month getting their children ready for the new academic year, which includes purchasing uniforms, new shoes, school supplies and backpacks. Some of these families have seen incredible hardship in the last year, with job hours cut or lost altogether, and increases in food and utility costs. Their ability to purchase even small items for their children’s education is very limited and several teachers of young children have reported that at least a quarter of their students do not bring the requested school supplies. This puts a burden on teachers to supply students with materials in class themselves and often leaves children unable to do assignments at home.

But we can help get our students off to a great start! School supply sales are everywhere and for even a couple of dollars you can help a child or teacher get what they need. St. Luke’s will be collecting basic school supplies (focusing on the needs of young children) through the month of August and will be delivering those supplies to four schools serving some of Jackson’s most deserving children: Arlington Elementary, Alexander Elementary, Whitehall Elementary and Washington-Douglas (which serves special education preschoolers).

Based on lists for kindergarteners distributed at area stores, here are the general supplies needed: crayons (16 or 24), blunt tip scissors, pencils (#2, large and standard size), writing tablets, notebook paper, glue sticks, facial tissues, moist baby wipes, hand sanitizer, and pencil boxes or pouches. Teachers can also use paper towels and any and all art supplies, including construction paper and stickers.

Investing in our community’s children is both personally rewarding, spiritually fulfilling and directly related to the future of our city and country. Please join us in giving every child the best start possible!

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED DURING RECOVERY

TOMMY RHOADS PREACHING AUGUST 9

Our own Tommy Rhoads is in his second year working toward becoming a deacon, an ordained ministry in the church. As a part of his formation process, Tommy is taking a course in homiletics. As a result, he will be preaching at Saint Luke's on August 9. Deacons are ordained to empower the servant ministry of the Church, seeking to strengthen the link between the world and the Church. At the Eucharist, a deacon normally reads the Gospel, leads the prayers of the people, introduces the confession of sin, sets and cleans up the table, serves the bread or wine, and says the dismissal. God willing and bishop consenting (and the creek don't rise), we might expect to have an ordination service for Tommy in the next year.

SAFEGUARDING GOD'S CHILDREN

SEPTEMBER 10, 2009, 6 - 8 P.M.

The topic of taking every possible step to keep children safe from sexual abuse, particularly in church setting, is a high priority in the Episcopal Church and in this Diocese. Therefore there are several training sessions held throughout the year in an effort to protect our children and our church. Those required to take this training, per the Diocesan guidelines, are all paid staff members, all parishioners working directly with children and all vestry members who are involved in leadership and policy making within the church.

The next session to be held at St. Luke's will be September 10, 2009 from 6 p.m. - 8 p.m. This is an important issue and it is required for many parishioners. If you have not had this training in the last 3 years and you are one of the people require to, please mark your calendars and plan to be in attendance. This training is also available to parents if you want to take extra steps to safeguard your children by knowing signs of abuse or signs of potential predators from any setting your child might be in.

If you find that this date simply doesn't work for you, there will be another session on November 12, 2009 at Holy Communion, Memphis from 5:30 - 8:00 p.m. You may call the diocesan office at 731-526-0023 to sign up for that session.

THE DIOCESE OF WEST TN HAPPENING #46

SEPTEMBER 4 - 6, 2009

Happening is a Christian experience presented by teenagers for teenagers with the help of clergy and lay adult leadership. The purpose of Happening is to provide a Christian Experience program to be one of the instruments within the Anglican Tradition to renew the Christian Church in the power of the Holy Spirit, in order that the Church may respond more readily to its call to spread the Kingdom of God throughout the world. Happening seeks to achieve this purpose by bringing young persons and adults to a fuller personal knowledge of and relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ and to a deeper level of commitment and apostleship.

Happening is open to any student in the 10th - 12th grade. This year's Happening will be Labor Day weekend, September 4 - 6. Registration is on a first come first served basis. Completed applications (forms and money) are accepted in the order they are received until the Happening is full or the deadline date is reached. Any incomplete applications received after the Happening deadline or after the Happening is full will be returned. Only 7 youth from each parish are allowed to attend at any one time. You must be sure to get Fr. Sean's signature on your application when you have filled it out for it to be considered complete. The cost is \$85 and the deadline is Friday, August 21, 2009. 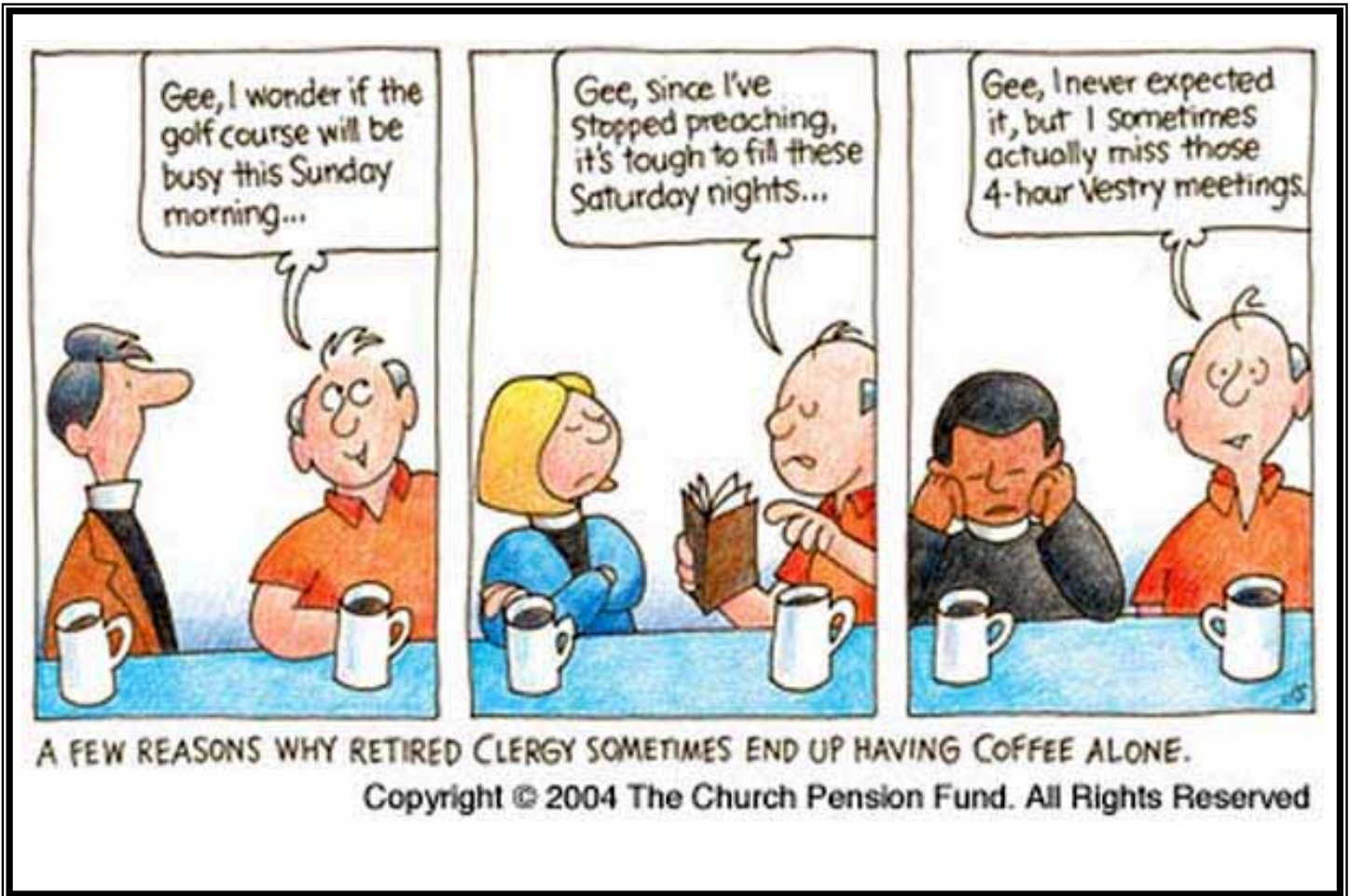
