FROM YOUR RECTOR... by the Reverend Sean Ferrell



At each and every Baptism, we renew the promises made at Baptism. How do we each fulfill the promises of our Baptismal Covenant?

What I know is that God calls all Christians to continue in the life and sacraments of the church (to be present and to participate), to love God and our neighbor, and to make God's Kingdom more fully known in our time. These lie at the heart of our Baptismal promises. But these attributes do not come naturally to us, I am afraid.

There is a new word (that is actually a very old word) that is being used again to describe the Church's educational mission. The word is "formation."

In earlier times, the word "formation" was primarily associated in church circles with seminary education and the shaping of monks and nuns. The formation of those training to be clergy involved worship, prayer, spiritual direction, and study. The goal was to shape and remake the person into the spiritual leader that the church needed.

In the church we now speak of Christian formation as not only referring to a process which only applies to clergy, but to the lifelong journey of being formed into the person God is calling us to be.

For Christians the journey of faith begins at birth, is formalized in Holy Baptism, is nurtured and fed by the Body and Blood of Christ, is informed continually in Christian education, is Confirmed and Reaffirmed in adulthood, and supported in prayer. In short, formation helps us live into those vows we make at Baptism.

And formation isn't just for young people, but is central to our soul's health every day of our lives. I invite you to take a close look at our Christian Education offerings and discern how God is calling you to be formed in your faith as a Christian, and join us on Rally Day (September 7).

We have several offerings for adults that I think you will enjoy. Our Upper Room Class will resume on September 7 (Rally Day) at 9:15 a.m. with a video lecture series: *History of the Bible: The Making of the New Testament*. The lectures are given by Professor Bart Ehrman of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. The class will deal with the formation of the canon of the New Testament.

Our Tuesday night Bible Study led by the Rev. Dr. Gene Davenport meets each Tuesday at 7:00 p.m. Gene is a retired professor of religion from Lambuth University and is Saint Luke's theologian in residence. This group is currently discussing the book of Genesis. While a university professor is teaching the course, it is accessible and relevant.

The same can be said for the Wednesday morning Bible study led by the Reverend Dr. Brady Whitehead. This study, which meets each week at 10 a.m., has traditionally focused upon a book of the Old Testament. It will resume on Wednesday, September 10.

This fall, I am teaching a Confirmation Class that is really more than a Confirmation Class. Its point is to strengthen your faith, and strangely enough, confirm literally means "with strength." The course itself is for all interested in learning more about the Episcopal Church, for those interested in being Confirmed, Received from another Christian Church, Re-affirming their baptismal vows, or in exploring an "adult faith". Really, it is for anyone interested in strengthening their faith. Classes will begin September 14th and will continue through Oct 12 and will meet at 9:15 a.m.

Our young children will have the opportunity to participate in their own Christian education during the Christian Ed hour, which also begins on Sept. 7. Our Sunday School teachers will continue to teach our congregation's little ones using the Episcopal Children's Curriculum. This fine curriculum teaches children the Bible, liturgy and traditions of The Church. It is rooted in scripture and incorporates The Book of Common Prayer and The Hymnal to teach church traditions and standard responses used during worship and major themes of Holy Scripture. And a reminder: our nursery is available during church school time for younger children, so that parents and older siblings can participate in Christian education.

Our EYC (Episcopal Youth Community) will again encompass grades 6-12 and will deal with Episcopal identity, the worship and life of the Church. And of course, there will be many fun activities along the way. Watch your monthly calendar and bulletin insert for meeting times. This group will gather for the first time this fall on Sunday, September 7, during the Rally Day picnic at Conger Park.

May this be a year filled with the promise of deeper faith and greater commitment to God's call as we seek to fulfill the promises made at our Baptism

SAFEGUARDING GOD'S CHILDREN

The topic of taking every possible step to keep children safe from sexual abuse, particularly in church setting, is a high priority in the Episcopal Church and in this Diocese. Therefore there are several training sessions held throughout the year in an effort to protect our children and our church. Those required to take this training, per the Diocesan guidelines, are all paid staff members, all parishioners working directly with children and all vestry members who are involved in leadership and policy making within the church.

The next session to be held at St. Luke's will be September 11, 2008 from 6 p.m. - 8 p.m. This is an important issue and it is required for many parishioners. If you have not had this training in the last 3 years and you are one of the people require to, please mark your calendars and plan to be in attendance. This training is also available to parents if you want to take extra steps to safeguard your children by knowing signs of abuse or signs of potential predators from any setting your child might be in.

If you find that this date simply doesn't work for you, there are other sessions available in Memphis. You may call the parish office for a list of those dates and locations.

Please sign up on the bulletin board by the parish office so we can have a count to set up the room and to be sure we have sufficient supplies. You may also call or e-mail the parish office at stlukes@aeneas.net to add your name to the list.

RALLY DAY AND ANNUAL PARISH PICNIC

Be sure to be here at 9:15 a.m. to sign up for Christian Education classes for all ages. There will be registration cards available that day. If you would like to sign up early, we will have cards available that you can drop in the offering plate or you can contact the parish office to have one mailed to you if you will be out of town that week.

Remember that Christian Education classes are an important part of the learning process to help us become better servants of Christ and better stewards of the blessings He has bestowed upon each of us. We would like to have 100% participation this year (and every year!)

ARA OSHAGAN - SPEAKER FOR GENOCIDES

PROJECT TO SPEAK AT ST. LUKE'S,

September 24th, 7:00 p.m. in Parish Hall

Ara Oshagan's work revolves around the themes of identity, community and aftermath.

Since 1995, he has been photographing survivors of the Armenian Genocide, a project that includes oral history and is called *The Genocide Project*. Working with photographer Levon Parian and a team of oral historians, this work was exhibited at the Downey Museum of Art in 1999 and attracted national attention, being the main feature in an [NPR Morning Edition](#) story.

Oshagan has also been photographing extensively in [Nagorno-Karabagh](#) for a book project with his father, well-known author, Vahe Oshagan. Featured in Photo District News, the book will be published by Edition Parantese in France. His work from Karabagh also took third place in the prestigious Visions 2001 National Photographic Project Competition sponsored by the Santa Fe Center for the Visual Arts.

Working with the USC Center for Religion and Civic Culture, Oshagan received a California Council on the Humanities Major Grant in 2001 to photograph the Armenian experience of Los Angeles. This work, called [Traces of Identity](#), was exhibited at the LA Municipal Art Gallery at Barnsdall Park from September to December 2004 and is currently on view at the Downey Museum of Art.

Oshagan has also been working in collaboration with Leslie Neale of Chance Films on a project to document [high-risk juvenile offenders](#) being tried as adults in California.

Oshagan's work is in the permanent collection of the Downey Museum of Art in Downey, California and the Museum of Contemporary Art in Yerevan, Armenia.
