STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN UPDATE

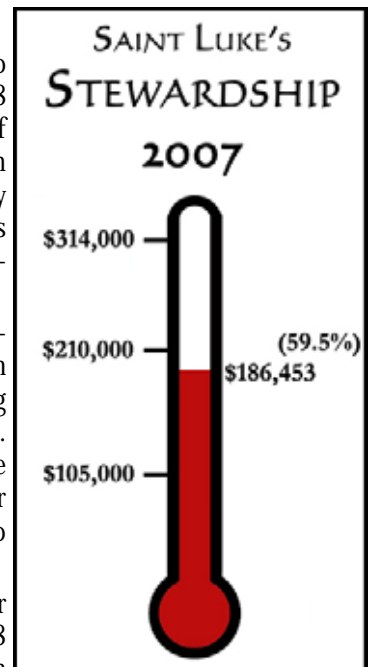

A big thank you to those parishioners who have turned in their pledge cards for the 2008 budget. Our stewardship campaign kicked off on Sunday, September 9 at our annual parish picnic. I am excited to report to you that only two weeks into the campaign, our pledges total \$186,453. We are 59.5% of the way toward our pledge goal of \$314,000.

As I mentioned, we are asking all parishioners who have pledged or contributed in the past to prayerfully consider increasing their pledge by 10% for the coming year. Also if you have never filled out a pledge card, please consider doing so this year. Our goal is to have 90% of our parishioners to turn in a pledge card.

An alms basin will be placed at the altar during Sunday services through October 28 for you to turn in your pledge. Pledges can also be mailed or turned into the church office. When filling out your pledge card, be sure to look at both sides of the card to sign up for any time and talents opportunities you would like to be involved in.

You are a wonderful parish family and it is a privilege to help lead this stewardship campaign along side Stewardship Chair, Jimmy Harrison.

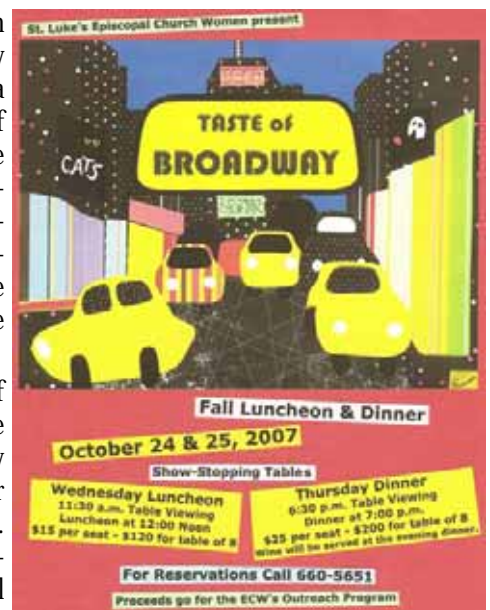


ECW ANNUAL FALL LUNCHEON & DINNER

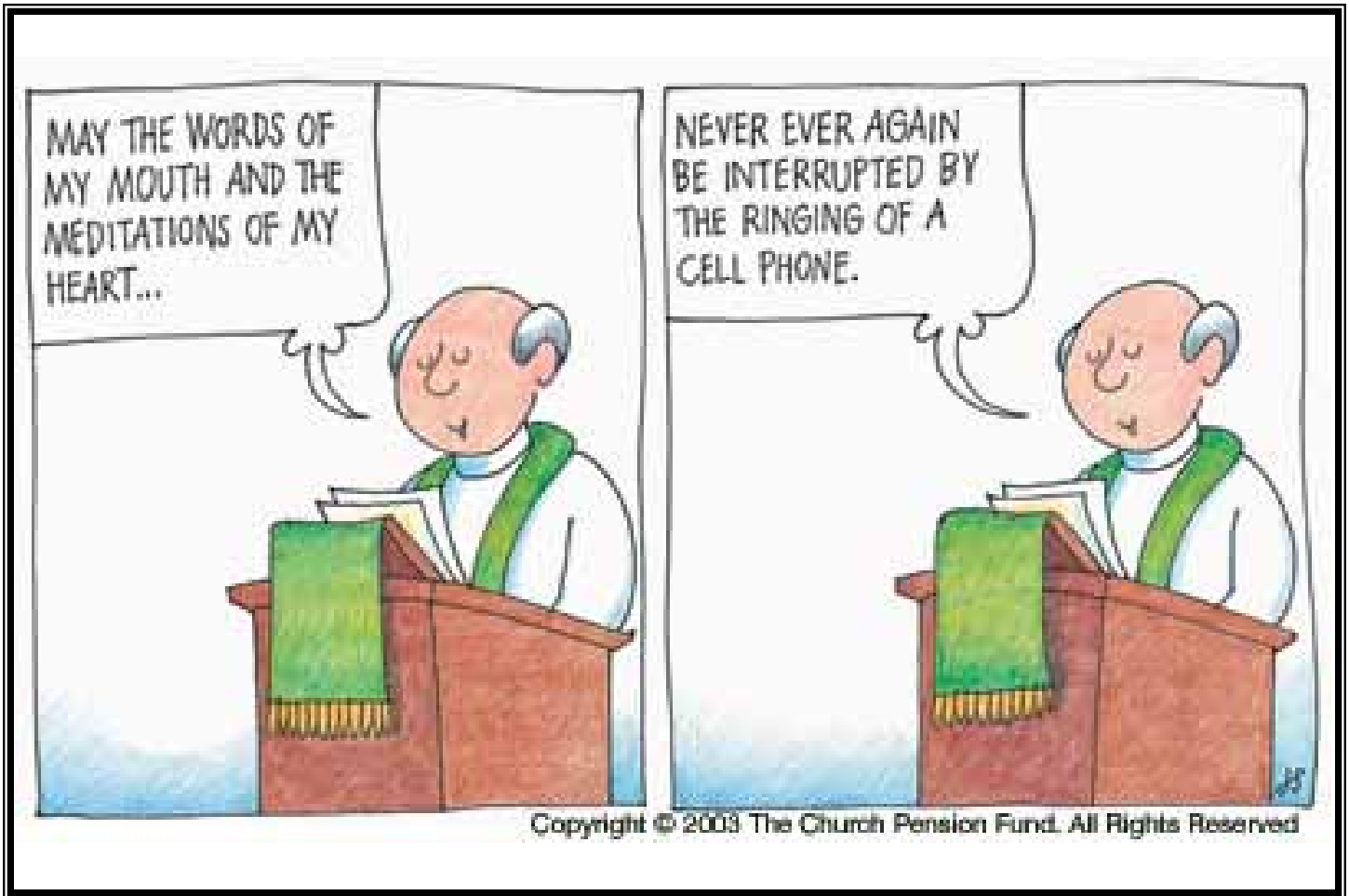
