Now, you might think we've had enough of celebrating recently, but again this month, there is *also* much to celebrate. On Sunday, November 4, we will celebrate the feast of All Saints'. On this day, all saints, famous and anonymous, are commemorated. One of the themes of the day is the saints in bliss, those who "from their labors rest" and who enjoy the felicity of God beyond the realm of time and space. These saints have fought the good fight, and we remember them, even those whose names are unknown to us.

There is another aspect to this notion of sainthood; it emphasizes the living identity of saints as fellow believers, those all around us-- "everyday saints" who exist neither in stained glass nor in heaven, but in the rough-and-tumble of our everyday lives.

I agree with Peter Gomes, who wrote, "Of all the Christian holidays, I find this one, in all of its senses, to be the most reassuring. I like the idea of the great and heroic ones who have gone on before: their names remind us that great lives were called to do great things for God. I like thinking of the saints beyond, not simply resting, but waiting for us to join them: they assure us of a future. And I like thinking of saints as ordinary people like ourselves, seeking to be faithful and holy here and now."

If you were with us on October 3rd, you know we celebrated our 175th Anniversary right. Between

a glorious service with Bishop Johnson presiding, a pretty darn good sermon (if I do say so myself), a silent auction with many amazing relics of our construction, and a wonderful dinner and a fabulous presentation and conversation with former Rector, the Reverend Alex Comfort, we did well. 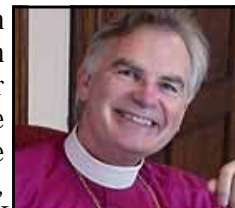

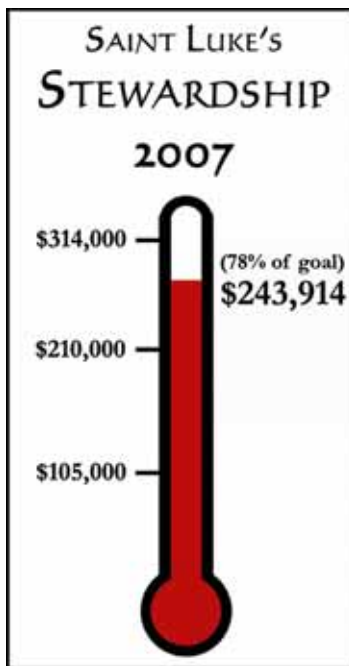

As we chug to the top, we need the 30 pledging units who pledged last year to respond (and prayerfully consider increasing by 10%). And we still need those of you who have never pledged to do so. Our goal is to get 90% participation from this group. Surely if our children can make a commitment, you can as well.

LOCALLY GROWN, HEALTHY FOOD

Did you know that, on average, the food you purchase at your local grocery store travels over 1,500 miles and that only 9 cents of every dollar you spend goes to the farmer who produced it? Buying local means fresher, healthier food with less pollution to the environment and as much as 50 cents of each dollar going back to the farmer and therefore, back to the Tennessee economy.



Avalon Acres, a community-supported agriculture farm, offers "subscriptions" for the fall/winter and spring/summer seasons, focusing on meat and poultry in the fall and on fresh produce in the spring. They are based in Hohenwald, Tennessee and work with more than 40 farmers in middle Tennessee to provide a wide variety of meats, poultry, produce and baked goods throughout the year. The animals are treated humanely and minimal, if any, pesticide is used on the produce.

While Avalon Acres isn't currently delivering to Jackson, biweekly carpooling has made it possible to extend an invitation for others in Jackson to buy subscriptions and have their items delivered to the church for pickup. A standard protein subscription for fall/winter is \$50 and includes a poultry (chicken or turkey), beef, pork and "your choice" portion (basically a meal's worth of each for at least two adults), plus bacon or sausage, and two dozen farm eggs. You can also order meat a la carte, as well as Amish baked goods, such as cinnamon rolls and bread.

This is a great opportunity to feed your family the best quality food, while helping family farms in Tennessee. While not a Saint Luke's project, we thought you might be interested. ROLLIN', ROLLIN', ROLLIN' ON THE RIVER.....

Well, we're not actually rollin' on a river, but we ARE rollin' on the road to debt retirement! You are to be commended again for making the effort to pay on time, and prepay, your commitment to the Capital Campaign.

THANK YOU!

We were able to pay an additional \$10,500 on principal in the month of September. That's rollin'! Outstanding pledges total \$115,673.67 against a loan balance of \$201,198. It doesn't take a mathematician to see that there is a shortfall. However (and again because of your loyalty to St. Luke's) we pull \$1500 per month from the church's operating income. Actually, this is a double-edged sword. With 3+ years left for the outstanding Capital Pledges to be paid, this means we're looking at pulling \$54,000+ from operational dollars. That is money we could use in many, many other ways. All this reinforces my contention that prepayment of your Capital Pledge is so very, very important. AND, if you've not become a part of this ministry, PLEASE do so. We need not only 100% of the original pledges, but additional pledges as well. We will gladly take any one-time contributions!

HOLD A PIECE OF SAINT LUKE'S HISTORY OWN A COMMEMORATIVE BRICK!

You can have a piece of Saint Luke's history in your own home! There are a few remaining bricks salvaged from Saint Luke's original nave that have been cleaned and labeled like the one shown. The brass nameplate reads, "St. Luke's Episcopal Church 1845-2003" as these bricks were a part of the building during those years.

**IRS GUIDELINES FOR
MONETARY CHARITABLE
DONATIONS**

Please do not file your 2007 tax return until you receive your Statement of Contributions from the parish office. The IRS has very specific guidelines to charitable donations. To assist you in filing your tax return, we have gathered the following information from the IRS. For more specific information, please go to their website at www.irs.gov.

“To deduct any charitable donation of money, a taxpayer must have a bank record or a written communication from the charity showing the name of the charity and the date and amount of the contribution. A bank record includes canceled checks, bank or credit union statements and credit card statements. Bank or credit union statements should show the name of the charity and the date and amount paid. Credit card statements should show the name of the charity and the transaction posting date.

Donations of money include those made in cash or by check, electronic funds transfer, credit card, and payroll deduction. For payroll deductions, the taxpayer should retain a pay stub, Form W-2 wage statement or other document furnished by the employer showing the total amount withheld for charity, along with the pledge card showing the name of the charity.

Prior law allowed taxpayers to back up their donations of money with personal bank registers, diaries or notes made around the time of the donation. Those types of records are no longer sufficient. This provision applies to contributions made in taxable years beginning after Aug. 17, 2006. For taxpayers that file returns on a calendar-year basis, including most individuals, the new provision applies to contributions made beginning in 2007.

The law does not change the prior-law requirement that a taxpayer get an acknowledgement from a charity for each deductible donation (either money or property) of \$250 or more. However, one statement containing all of the required information may meet the requirements of both provisions.

TAX BREAK FOR IRA OWNERS GIVING TO CHARITY

An IRA owner, age 70 ½ or over, can directly transfer tax-free, up to \$100,000 per year to an eligible charitable organization. This option is available in tax years 2006 and 2007. Eligible IRA owners can take advantage of this provision, regardless of whether they itemize their deductions. Distributions from employer-sponsored retirement plans, including SIMPLE IRAs and simplified employee pension (SEP) plans are not eligible.

To qualify, the funds must be contributed directly by the IRA trustee to the eligible charity. Amounts so transferred are not taxable and no deduction is available for the amount given to the charity.

Not all charities are eligible under this provision. For example, donor-advised funds and supporting organizations are not eligible recipients.

Transferred amounts are counted in determining whether the owner has met the IRA’s required minimum distribution rules. Where individuals have made nondeductible contributions to their traditional IRAs, a special rule treats transferred amounts as coming first from taxable funds, instead of proportionately from taxable and nontaxable funds, as would be the case with regular distributions. ¹

If you are interested in taking advantage of this new law, please contact your tax preparer or the trustee of your IRA plan to see if you meet the requirements and get the special forms required by the IRS. Please remember that at this point, this will only be available for the 2007 calendar year.

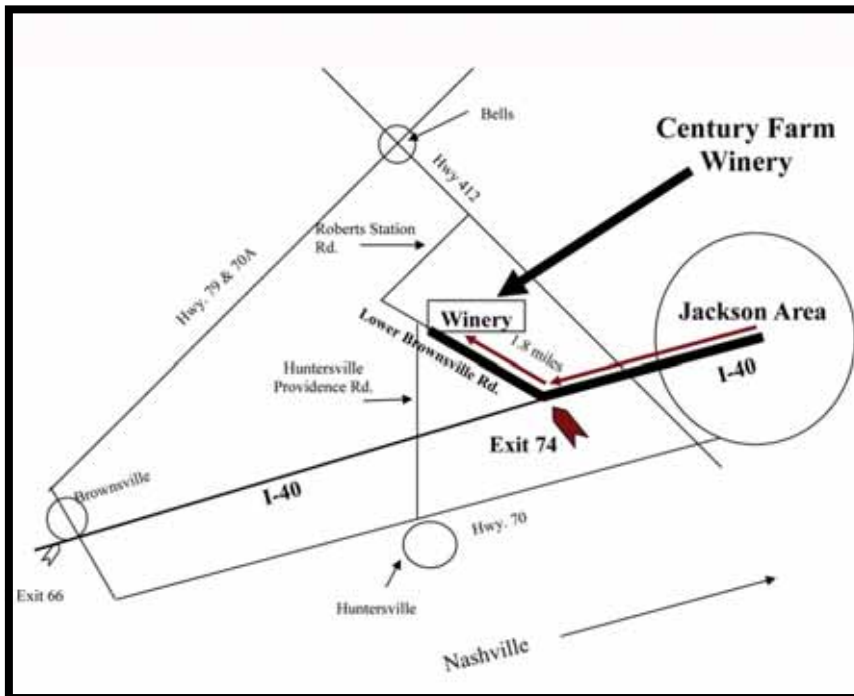
SAINTS ALIVE!

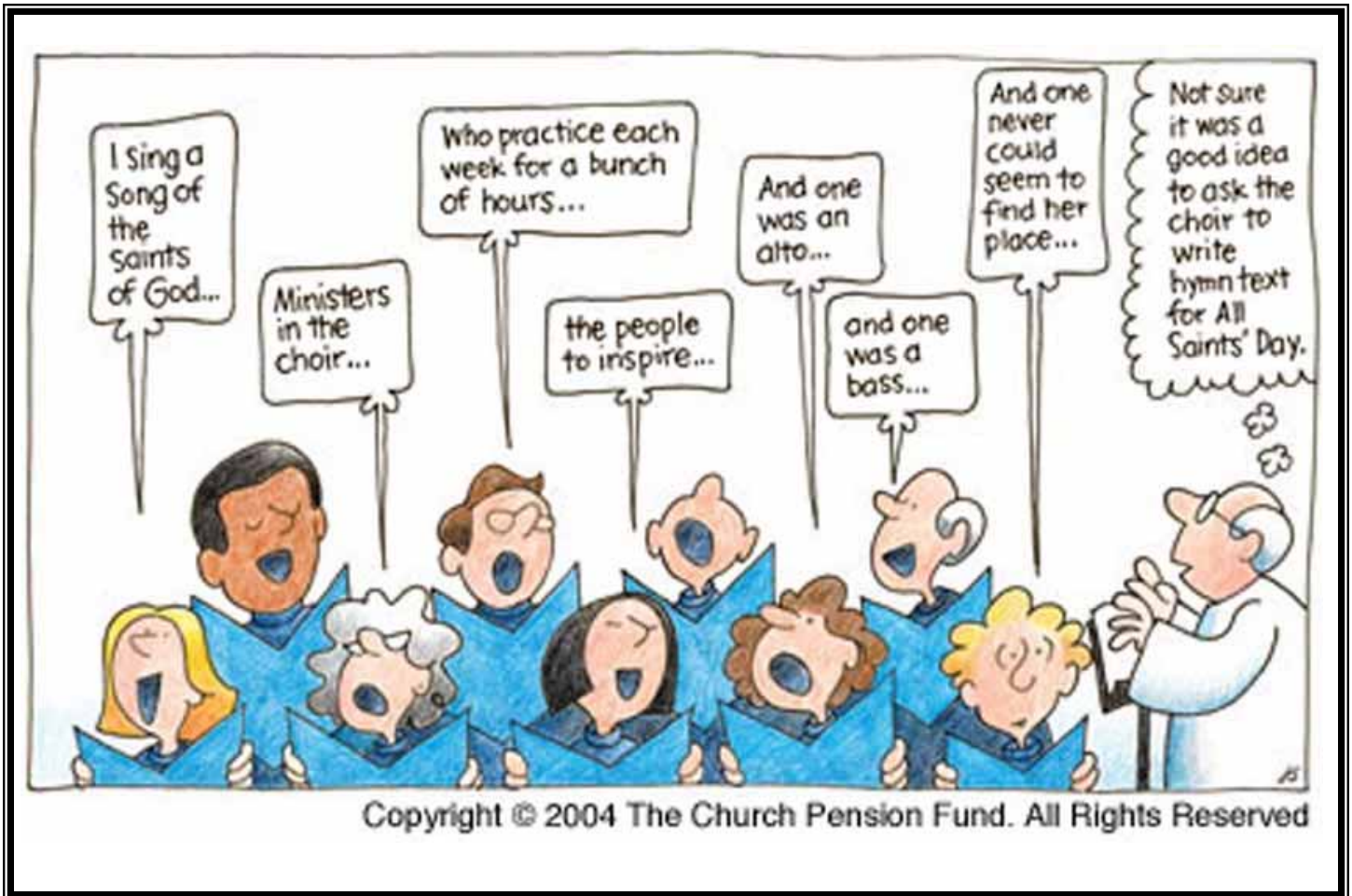
